FDA requires that Medication Guides be issued with certain prescribed drugs and biological products when the Agency determines that: certain information is necessary to prevent serious adverse effects

### Medication Guides | FDA

The FDA Med Guides Printer Tool depends on third-party components to process and print Portable Document Format (PDF) documents. These components are Windows Server, Java Runtime Environment (JRE) and Adobe Reader DC. These components must be properly installed and configured prior to installing and running the FDA Med Guides Printer Tool.

FDA Design Controls. Design controls for medical devices are regulated by the FDA under 21 CFR 820.30. They must be implemented by manufacturers of class II or III medical devices (and some class I devices). Outside of the U.S. a set of very similar regulations (nearly exactly the same, actually) are dictated by ISO 13485:2016.

Drug-Drug Interactions . The effectiveness of a drug can often be reduced if the action of one drug diminishes the action of another. Since drugs are commonly classified by their mode and mechanism of action, any interaction affecting one drug will usually affect drugs of the same class, either by interfering with their absorption or the way in which the body metabolizes the drug.
