How to Teach Thematic Comparative Literature

Introduce the comparative and superlative forms for one syllable adjectives ending in consonant-vowel-consonant. Show your students picture or photos of different seasons and weather conditions. Introduce the comparative: T: The weather in May can be hot, but the weather in June is hotter than in May.

How to Teach Comparatives and Superlatives

Ask students what they know about -er and -est words, as well as the word "than". Explain that -er adjectives are for comparing

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two things, while -est words are used to compare three or more things. For older students, introduce and use the terms "comparative" and "superlative" repeatedly and hold students accountable for knowing these terms.

In this dialogue-based lesson, students listen to a short market survey interview with a consumer about her opinions on consumer electronics brands. The focus is on the comparative and superlative forms of adjectives. At the end of the worksheet, there is a role play in which students interview each other.

Put students in groups of four and then set a time limit of about five minutes. On your signal, each group should write as many comparative and superlative statements about the people in the room as they can. At the end of the time period, have one group share their sentences.

4 Excellent Activities for Using Comparatives and ...

After answering the usual comprehension questions, students are asked to find comparative and/ or superlative forms in the texts and then to make generalisations about how they are

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formed. Students can then speak on the same or similar topics in the practice stage. This text-based method usually works reasonably well.

How to teach comparative and superlative adjectives ...

In general, comparative adjectives don't cause many issues for students. The general rule is the one-syllable words take the -er suffix while adjectives with two or more syllables take use more in front of the adjectives. This rule — or tendency — works well for ESL students despite the large number of exceptions.

A Practical Compromise to Teaching World History: Thematic ...

The similarity of certain grammar structures, such as conditional forms and linking language, lend themselves to teaching in larger chunks, rather than focusing on one form at a time. This is also true of the comparative and superlative forms. Introducing both the comparative and the superlative simultaneously students can begin speaking about a wide variety of subjects in a more natural form ...

Comparative and Superlative Forms Lesson Plan

Useful for Teaching: Positive Adjectives, Comparative Adjectives, Descriptive Adjectives This is primarily a writing activity. Students should work individually to describe their best friend. On the board, write down "appearance," "personality" and "compared to me."

The way it works is that you make sets of cards with common vocabulary on them. For example dog, cat, pencil, cell phone, apple, cucumber, etc. You'll want to make a set of 24 of them for every 4 students. The first students draw the first two cards and then have to make a sentence using a comparative adjective.
