Flores and Ganz (2007) investigated delays in the components of reading comprehension in individuals with ASD and other developmental delays and implemented an intervention that used direct instruction to address those components. Four elementary students participated in the study, two of whom were diagnosed with an ASD.

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Young children quickly learn to respond to the spoken language of other people (i.e., receptive language) as they begin to orient to their own name and familiar voices, follow simple instructions, and identify a wide range of stimuli and events in their environment (Hart & Risley, 1995; Lovaas, 1977). Hundreds of everyday interactions with caregivers readily produce receptive language skills as ...

Teaching Receptive Language Skills

If individuals experience repeated developmental failures, inadequacies sometimes result. However, when the individual experiences repeated successes, health is promoted. For example, a child who does not walk by 20 months may demonstrate delayed gross motor ability that slows exploration and manipulation of the environment.
